



Book Launching of 'Janakapura Megalithic Mortuary Complex; Excavation Report 2022'



From 2020, the Department of Archeology and Heritage Management has been launching a research project related to Ma Oya Lower Valley in Mullaitivu District. In association with the mentioned project, the excavation based on megalithic burial site in Janakapura was conducted in January 2022. The excavation report was compiled as a book which includes the information discovered from the excavation, exploration conducted in the peripheral area as well as a series of researches based on the environmental and social conditions. The book named 'Janakapura Megalithic Mortuary Complex; Excavation Report 2022' was launched on 04th April 2023 in the premises of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities. Furthermore, an academic discussion about various research topics

which have been included in the book was held together with the launching and certificates were of awarded to the excavation team as an acknowledgment. Academic, non-academic staff members and students representing various departments and faculties participated in this program.

















Artifact Exhibition

In association with the book launching of Janakapura Megalithic Mortuary Complex; Excavation Report 2022', an artifact exhibition was organized in the Dr. Siran U. Deraniyagala Research Museum of the Department of Archaeology and Heritage Management on 04th April 2023 and it contained the artifacts retrieved from different archaeological researches conducted by the department since 2013. Significantly, the exhibition was filled with rare material facts which belong to the time period between Pre-historic and Early-historic era. This is the first exhibition that revealed the archaeological finds reported from Janakapura megalithic burial site to the public.













Artifact Conservation Program

A number of different artifacts retrieved from Janakapura megalithic burial site were taken to the department laboratory for post excavation work. As the first stage of conservation process, a Program organized by the department and Mrs. Menaka Rodrigo, the main artifact conservator of Sigiriya and Polonnaruwa projects – Central Cultural Fund joined as a resource person. It was held in March 2023 and students of 3rd and 4th year batches were engaged in activities to fulfill the practical requirement of honors degree program in Archaeology and Heritage management. This Program was assisted by the temporary staff members of the department and students were trained in post excavation work done in laboratories, sampling, indoor recording, laboratory analyzing, consolidating pottery and metal artifacts, organizing artifact exhibitions respectively.













'Archaeo-Theatre' Movie and Documentary Exhibition



The Society of Archeology and Heritage Management of the Department of Archeology and Heritage Management, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka has started a weekly movie and documentary exhibition named 'Archaeo-Theatre' on 22nd of February 2023. This can be identified as a small effort which helps to create an outstanding graduate; full of wisdom and humanity. The aim of the association is to screen a number of subject related and various themed movies and documentaries based on national and international contexts.

Field Visit based on Proto-historic Sites in Yan Oya Middle Basin

According to archaeological studies, it can be identified that most of proto-historic sites in Sri Lanka are located in Yan Oya basin. 


Reminiscence of Heritage (2nd Stage) - Webinar Series









3. Publications in the indexed journal







Field Visit to Dambana Tribal Village

In a bid to provide an enriching learning experience for students studying Mass Communication and History in the Department of Humanities Rajarata University of Sri Lanka, a field visit to the Dambana tribal village was organized on the 9th May. The visit, centered on the theme of "Ethnicity, Subculture, and Social Evolution," aimed to explore Sri Lankan social history, evolution, and the nature of indigenous life, along with its associated folk forms.

Of particular significance during the field visit was an interview with Uruwarige Wannilatto, the tribal leader. Institutional Study on Radio Media and Creative Communication

On the 27th May, a group of 62 Mass Communication students from the Department of Humanities visited the head office of the Sri Lanka Broadcasting Corporation in Colombo for an institutional study on the subjects of "Radio Media Studies" and "Creative Communication." Department of Information Technology

Establishment of New IT Laboratory

The UGC's "IT for Humanities" project, initiated in 2020, received a substantial AHEAD grant of 16.3 Million to fortify the IT infrastructure of the faculty. 








• පොසොන් බැති ගී programme






Visit to Mahiyanganaya, Dambana and Hennanigala



The Independence Print Exhibition draws from the L. S. W. Pathirathne Collection and has been curated by Dr. George I. H. Cooke, Initiator of the Awarelogue Initiative. It is a project of the Awarelogue Initiative, to enhance awareness and dialogue at a key milestone in Sri Lanka's journey. Consisting of 22 panels, each panel is slightly larger than a newspaper and is movable, and can be placed on tables or rested against stands to enhance viewing.





Parliamentary Internship Programme



The Parliament of Sri Lanka with the support of the National Democratic Institute (NDI) and USAID launched a parliamentary internship program, providing young professionals and students with practical experience in policy development and public service. The program was launched on March 1 in Parliament under the patronage of Speaker Hon. Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena, and Secretary General of Parliament Mr. Dhammika Dasanayake,

Chief of Staff and Deputy Secretary General Mrs. Kushani Rohanadeera and Assistant Secretary General Mr. Tikiri Jayathilaka, Senior Resident Country Director of the National Democratic Institute (NDI) Mrs. Thusitha Pilapitiya and a group of officials were present. The Hon. Speaker delivered the keynote speech at the inauguration. Following outreach efforts to all the national universities in Sri Lanka, a group of interns was carefully chosen from the eight universities that responded. Accordingly, eight state Universities, namely, Colombo, Sri Jayewardenepura, Kelaniya, Peradeniya, Rajarata, Jaffna, Ruhuna, and Sabaragamuwa have collaborated for the internship program with a group of selected 35 interns.

The program's selection criteria and structure ensure a comprehensive and tailored experience, with the curriculum designed to develop skills and knowledge for different career paths. NDI, in collaboration with the parliament, conducted a three-day residential orientation program aimed at providing a deeper insight into the intern role. The program featured several sessions covering legislative development, engaging with Parliament, and various modes of interaction with Parliament. The heads of departments and sections of the Parliament conducted the program.

The program concluded with a recap and evaluation session by students, followed by an open discussion where interns had the opportunity to raise questions. Following a three-day orientation program, the interns have been allocated to their respective departments, and throughout their internship period, they will receive hands-on working experience with the Parliament of Sri Lanka.



The program's curriculum promotes inclusivity, diversity, and skill development for different career paths. The initiative aims to create goodwill ambassadors for parliament, address the trust deficit between parliament and youth, promote democracy, and educate young people about the Parliament of Sri Lanka. The program highlights the Parliament's commitment to the Open Parliament Initiative and aims to address the trust deficit

between Parliament and youth while safeguarding democracy.

Department Research: A Comparative Study on Nature of Substance Abuse in Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka's experience with the drug abuse problem is unique in many ways. Substance abuse becomes a major social problem existing in society these days. Studying the nature of substance abuse in rural, suburban, and urban regions comparatively lead to identifying the relationship between substance abuse and gender, age groups, economic status, and other sociological factors comprehensively. The key assumptions and findings that the researchers would like to accomplish through this research will be significant for the policy-making process pertaining to the control and prevention of substance abuse in selected contexts considering the environmental and geographical factors and specific features existing in the particular areas. These research findings will broadly be used for the proper awareness and education of law enforcement officials and the community about the nature of substance abuse and vulnerable opportunities prevailing in such areas which may cause to prevent and control being victimized by substance abuse.

This research would be a fundamental source document available for the researchers, academics, and scholars to use the extended future studies regarding substance abuse and further findings of this research would resource the professionals who designed planning modules for the control and prevention of Substance abuse to the law enforcement agencies and authorized institutions. In fact, the revealing information of the research would facilitate the relevant authorities to conduct their studies on a particular field further. The main significance of this research can be identified as this research study help to fill the gap of knowledge based on Sri Lankan context regarding substance abuse in a comparative manner.



Field Trips: Department of Social Sciences stepping to the society with Sociology

Visit to Teripehe



In 1950s, a Turkish social anthropologist, Nur Yalman, visited the village of Teripehe a in the Central Province for an anthropological study of the caste system, kinship and marriage system that belonged to the rural society of Sri Lanka, and the study conducted in that village was published as "Under the Bo Tree". Sri Lankan scholars like Prof. K. Karunathilake and Prof. Dilan Gunawardena have also conducted studies based on the village of Teripehe in order to experimentally identify the contemporary

changes and characteristics of the rural social context. To study the modern nature of this rural change, as an extension of the aforementioned study, the Sociology Honours Degree Final Year team of the Department of Social Sciences of the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka engaged in a field trip to Teripehe village on 11th and 12th of May 2023 under the guidance of the Head of the department, Professor E.M.S Ekanayake. Under the leadership of Professor Dilan Gunawardena, the field trip took place under the supervision and participation of Lecturer Prabhash Siriwardhana, Temporary Lecturer Pathum Niwantha Haputhanthri, Temporary Lecturer Pavithra Wickramage, and Temporary Lecturer Manori Perera for two days. Research was conducted at the surrounding areas

of Teripehe and Helagama villages. The objective of this field trip was to provide students with a hands-on experience in conducting anthropological research and studying cultural diversity of urbanizing areas. The trip aimed to deepen their understanding of rural to urban transformation methods, fieldwork techniques, and the diverse cultural practices in a specific community and understanding the rural society under development and urbanization and how it impacts the changes in urbanization to nature of the rural community.




Visit to Moragahathenna and Kaluganga Projects and Resettleed Areas

Moragahakanda is a major dam and reservoir project located in Sri Lanka. It is situated in the Matale and Polonnaruwa districts, about 180 kilometres north-east of Colombo, the capital city. The project was initiated to address the water needs of the dry zone regions of Sri Lanka and to support irrigation, hydroelectric power generation, and water supply to local communities. The objective of this field trip was to provide students with an opportunity to study rural sociology in the context of

a resettled area. The trip aims to deepen their understanding of the social, cultural, and economic dynamics in a community that has undergone forced or voluntary resettlement. Understanding the Social Welfare procedure and project planning using PRA and RRA and CEI methods and understanding the rural community changes under development and researching on impact of the development towards social stratification were specific objectives. The field trip was held on 16th of May 2023 and undergraduates who are following Rural Sociology / SOCI 21023 and Social Work and Social Welfare / SOCI 31033course unit took part in this field work.







Soft Skills Laboratory: Empower Undergraduates with an Academic Atmosphere

The Soft Skills Laboratory of Department of Social Sciences was established and opened for undergraduates from 06th of April, 2023. The Soft Skills Laboratory contains a Smart Board for academic functions and Air condition facilities for lectures and academic activities.
